This plan describes the Contractor's INFOSEC Anonymity Plan (IAP) and identifies the procedures to be used to ensure anonymity between the Government and the prime Contractor, ensuring that any offshore vendors, suppliers, manufacturers, or distributors are unaware of the relationship between the item being purchased and the Department of Defense (DoD).
2. This Data Item Description (DID) is applicable to the acquisition of DoD systems and equipment.

4. This DID contains the format and content preparation instructions for the data product generated by the specific and discrete task requirement, as delineated in the contract.

 - Contract number
 - Security classification

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3. Content: The IAP shall include an outline of the Contractor's offshore parts procurement procedures used for the design, production, or packaging of INFOSEC equipment, components and parts. The IAP is to place emphasis on how these procedures ensure that the offshore subcontractors, vendors, distributors, or manufacturers of these items are not made aware of the relationship between the prime Contractor and the Department of Defense (DoD) through any aspect of the procurement.
