CLOTH, DUCK, NYLON

This amendment forms a part of MIL-C-7219F, dated 19 March 1987, and is approved for use by all Departments and Agencies of the Department of Defense.

* 3 2, line 7, after "polyamide" delete the remainder of the paragraph and substitute: ". A polyamide (nylon) with a melting point of at least 200°C (392°F) shall be used for all types and classes except for Type III, Class 3 materials which shall use a polyamide with a minimum melting point of 244°C (471°F) when determined in accordance with 4.5. The yarn shall not be bleached in any manner or in any subsequent process.
