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*Delete 4.1 entirely and add new:

"4.1 <u>Responsibility for inspection.</u> Unless otherwise specified in the contract or purchase order, the contractor is responsible for the performance of all inspection requirements (examinations and tests) as specified herein. Except as otherwise specified in the contract or purchase order, the

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contractor may use his own or any other facilities suitable for the performance of the inspection requirements specified herein, unless disapproved by the Government. The Government reserves the right to perform any of the inspections set forth in this specification where such inspections are deemed necessary to ensure supplies and services conform to prescribed requirements "

Add "4.1.1 Responsibility for compliance All items shall meet all requirements of sections 3 and 5. The inspection set forth in this specification shall become a part of the contractor's overall inspection system Or quality program. The absence of any inspection requirements in the specification shall not relieve the contractor of the responsibility of ensuring that all products or supplies submitted to the Government for acceptance comply with all requirements of the contract. Sampling inspection, as part of manufacturing operations, is an acceptable practice to ascertain conformance to requirements, however, this does not authorize submission of know defective material, either indicated or actual, nor does it commit the Government to accept defective material."

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Delete "section 5" entirely and add new.

"5 PACKAGING:

- 5.1. <u>Preservation.</u> Preservation shall be level A, C, or industrial as specified. (see 6.2)
- 5.1.1. <u>Level A.</u> Unless otherwise specified by the procuring activity, each oil cooler shall be individually preserved and packaged according to MIL-STD-2073-1. The method of preservation shall conform to method 1C-1 of MIL-P-116.
- 5.1.2 <u>Level C.</u> Each oil cooler shall be preserved and packaged in a manner which will afford adequate protection against corrosion deterioration, and physical damage during shipments form supply source to the first receiving activity for immediate use.
- 5.1.3. <u>Industrial</u>. The Industrial preservation of valve shall be in accordance with ASTM D3951.
- 5.2. Packing. Packing shall be level A, B, C, or as specified (see 6.2)
- 5.2.1 <u>Level (s) A, B, or C.</u> The level of packing shall be specified by the procuring activity. The level of packing shall be accomplished in accordance with the requirements outlined in MIL-STD-2073-1.
- 5.2.2, Industrial. The packaged oil cooler shall be packed in accordance with ASTMD3951,
- 5.3. <u>Marking</u>. In addition to any special marking required by the contract or order, marking shall be in accordance with MIL-STD-129.
- 5.4 <u>Inspection and test.</u> Test of methods of preservation and packaging shall be accomplished in accordance with section 4 of ML-P-116 to insure compliance with section 5 of this specifications."
