MODIFICATION IDENTIFICATION PLATE

This specification is approved for use by the Department of the Navy and is available for use by all Departments and Agencies of the Department of Defense.

The requirements for acquiring the product described herein shall consist of this specification sheet and MIL-DTL-15024.

REQUIREMENTS:

<u>Type</u>. The identification device shall be selected to match the application, the operational and maintenance environments of the product it identifies. Type A, G or H shall be used.

<u>Color Style</u>. The color style selected shall be III or IV. The color style shall comply with operational and tactical requirements.

<u>Size</u>. Size 3 is the preferred size for modification identification plates. Other sizes may be used or dimensional changes for an increased number of entries may be made when design requirements indicate this need.

<u>Material</u>. The material shall be compatible with the operational and maintenance environments of the end item.

<u>Serial Number</u>. The serial number on the modification identification plates shall be the same as the number which was assigned to the original equipment. The serial number shall be included on the plate as shown.

<u>Mounting</u>. Plates requiring mechanical fasteners shall be mounted by removable screws and lockwashers or locknuts.

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<u>DISTRIBUTION STATEMENT A</u>. Approved for public release; distribution is unlimited.

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Format and information. Typical format and information are shown.

<u>Changes from previous issue</u> Marginal notations are not used in this revision to identify changes with respect to the previous issue due to the extent of the changes.




FIGURE 1. Modification identification plate.
