2.2 Other publications. The following document forms a part of this specification. Unless otherwise indicated, the issue in effect on date of invitation for bids shall apply.

CONSOLIDATED CLASSIFICATION COMMITTEE

Consolidated Freight Classification Rules. (Application for copies should be addressed to the Consolidated Classification Committee, 202 Chicago Union Station, Chicago 6, Ill.)

3. REQUIREMENTS

- 3.1 Material. The rules shall be made of naval brass conforming to Specification MIL-N-994.




FIGURE 1. Sounding rules—jointed.

- 3.2 Design. The rules shall be as shown on figure 1.
- 3.3 Graduations with figures, in inches and feet, shall be plainly and permanently stamped on one side of the rule. The rule shall be graduated from the bottom. Numerals shall be 3/16 inch high.
- 3.4 Workmanship shall be first class in every respect.

4. QUALITY ASSURANCE PROVISIONS

4.1 Sampling for lot acceptance.

- 4.1.1 Inspection lot. A lot shall consist of all sounding rules offered for delivery at one time.
- 4.1.2 Sampling for examination. A random sample of rules shall be selected from each inspection lot of material offered for inspection with lot acceptance based on the following sampling inspection requirements in accordance with Standard MIL-STD-105.

The Government inspector may institute tightened or reduced inspection in accordance with Standard MIL-STD-105.

- 4.2 Examination. The sample rules selected in accordance with 4.1.2 shall be examined by the inspector to verify conformance with the requirements of this specification. Failure to conform to the specification requirements shall be counted as a defect and the rule shall be rejected. If the number of such nonconforming rules in any sample exceeds the acceptance number for that sample, the lot represented by the sample shall be rejected. Rejected lots may be offered again for inspection provided the contractor has removed or reworked all nonconforming products.
- 4.3 Material. The composition of the material shall be verified in accordance with the quality assurance provisions of Specification MIL-N-994.

5. PREPARATION FOR DELIVERY

5.1 Preservation and packaging.

5.1.1 Level A. Rules shall be individually packaged in accordance with method III of

Specification MIL-P-116. Unit containers shall conform to Specification PPP-B-566, PPP-B-676, MIL-B-4229, PPP-B-636 or MIL-C-3955.

5.1.2 Level C. Rules shall be preserved and packaged in accordance with the manufacturer's commercial practice.

5.2 Packing.

5.2.1 Level A. Rules, packaged in accordance with level A or C as specified (see 6.1), shall be packed in overseas type wood cleated fiberboard, nailed wood, wirebound wood, corrugated or solid fiberboard, wood cleated paper overlaid, or wood cleated plywood boxes conforming to Specifications PPP-B-591, PPP-B-621, PPP-B-585, (class 2 or 3). PPP-B-636 (class 3), MIL-B-10377 or PPP-B-601, respectively. Shipping containers shall have case liners conforming to Specification MIL-L-10547 and shall be closed and sealed in accordance with the appendix thereto. Case liners for boxes conforming to Specification PPP-B-636 may be omitted provided all joints of the boxes are sealed with tape as specified in the appendix of the box specification. Box closures shall be as specified in the applicable box specification or appendix thereto. The gross weight of wood boxes shall not exceed 200 pounds: that of fiberboard boxes shall not exceed the weight limitations of the applicable box specification.

5.2.2 Level B. Rules, packaged in accordance with level A or C as specified (see 6.1), shall be packed in domestic type wood cleated fiberboard, nailed wood, wirebound wood, corrugated or solid fiberboard, wood cleated plywood, or wood cleated paper overlaid boxes conforming to Specifications PPP-B-591, PPP-B-621, PPP-B-585, PPP-B-636, PPP-B-601 and MIL-B-10377, respectively. Closures shall be as specified in the applicable box specification, or appendix thereto. Fiberboard boxes shall conform to the special requirements of the applicable box

specification. The gross weight of wood boxes shall not exceed 200 pounds, that of fiberboard boxes shall not exceed the weight limitations of the applicable box specification.

5.2.3 Level C. Rules, packaged in accordance with level A or C as specified (see 6.1), shall be packed in a manner to insure safe delivery and acceptance at destination. Containers or method of shipment shall comply with the Consolidated Freight Classification Rules or other carrier regulations applicable to the mode of transportation.

5.3 Marking. In addition to any special marking specified in the contract or order, or herein, each unit and intermediate packing and shipping container shall be marked in accordance with Standard MIL—STD-129.

6. NOTES

6.1 Ordering data. Procurement documents should specify the following:

- (a) Title, number, and date of this specification.
- (b) Depth of the tank and length and diameter of sounding tube for which each sounding rule is required.
- (c) Selection of applicable level of preservation and packaging and packing (see 5.1 and 5.2).
