MILITARY SPECIFICATION

RESCUE EQUIPMENT, HELICOPTER

This specification is mandatory for use by all Departments and Agencies of the Department of Defense.

1. SCOPE

1.1 This specification covers the general requirements for helicopter rescue equipment. Specific requirements are covered in the applicable detail specifications (see 6.3).

2. APPLICABLE DOCUMENTS

2.1 The following documents of the issue in effect on date of invitation for bids or request for proposal, form a part of this specification to the extent specified herein.

(Copies of specifications, standards, and drawings required by suppliers in connection with specific procurement functions should be obtained from the procuring activity or as directed by the contracting officer.)

3. REQUIREMENTS

3.1 General - The general requirements specified herein are supplementary to detail specifications for the construction of helicopter rescue equipment. Whenever there is a difference in requirements between this specification and the detail specification, the detail specification shall govern.

3.2 Materials - Materials shall be as specified in the detail specifications and drawings.

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3.3 Construction - Construction shall be in accordance with the detail specification and drawings.

3.4 Performance - Performance shall be as specified in the detail specifications and drawings.

3.5 Marking - Items shall be marked for identification in accordance with MIL-STD-130. Any additional marking shall be as specified by the procuring activity in the contract or order.

4. QUALITY ASSURANCE PROVISIONS

4.1 Responsibility for inspection - Unless otherwise specified in the contract or purchase order, the supplier is responsible for the performance of all inspection requirements as specified herein. Except as otherwise specified, the supplier may utilize his own facilities or any commercial laboratory acceptable to the Government. The Government reserves the right to perform any of the inspections set forth in the specification where such inspections are deemed necessary to assure supplies and services conform to prescribed requirements.

4.2 Inspection of materials and components - The supplier is responsible for insuring that materials and components used were manufactured and inspected in accordance with the requirements of referenced subsidiary specifications and standards to the extent specified herein, or, if none, in accordance with the requirements of this and detail specifications.

4.3 Sampling for inspection and acceptance - Unless otherwise specified, samples shall be selected in accordance with MIL-STD-105.

5. PREPARATION FOR DELIVERY

5.1 General - Preservation, packaging and packing shall be in accordance with applicable detail specification.

5.2 Marking - Interior packages and exterior containers shall be marked in accordance with requirements of the detail specification.

6. NOTES

6.1 Intended use - The helicopter rescue equipment covered by this specification are intended for use in assisting personnel performing rescue work from helicopter aircraft.

6.2 Ordering data - Procurement documents should specify the following:

(a) Title, number and date of this and applicable detail specification.

(b) Stock number.

(c) Selection of applicable levels of packaging and packing (see 5.1).

6.3 Detail specifications - The following detail specifications for helicopter rescue equipment form a part of this specification:
