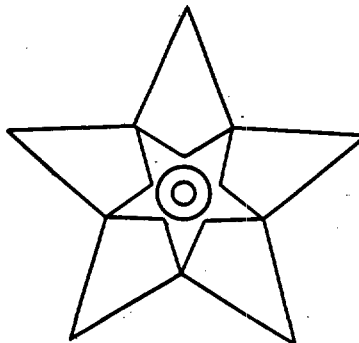

REQUIREMENTS

1. The outside diameter of the star shall be 3-5/8 inches.
2. The depth at center of the star shall be 1/2 inch.
3. Star to conform to detailed requirements shown on Drawing C&R No. 220598, piece number 7.
4. Star to be of chrome-plated scrap brass.
5. Star(s) are used as insignia on the bow of standard boats converted to barges for the use of a Flag or General Officer.
6. Referenced documents shall be the issue in effect on date of invitation for bids.
7. This standard takes precedence over documents referenced herein.
