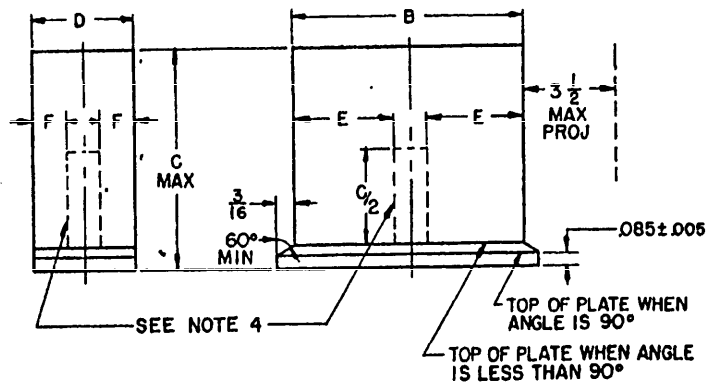

- All dimensions in inches.
- Unless otherwise specified, tolerances are $\pm 1/32$ on fractions.
- If a front panel is used, it projects no more than $1/16$ beyond the top and sides of the case and is considered part of the case.
- Center of gravity for cases used with class A mounting bases does not fall outside limits shown by dotted lines. The weight of the connectors and 1 foot of the attached cabling is considered for establishing location of the center of gravity.
- For use on mounting bases when a specific load is isolated, the weight range is the specific load for which the base is designed ± 15 percent. (See MS91404.)
- Qualification inspection not required.
- Referenced documents shall be of the issue in effect on date of invitation for bids.
- This standard takes precedence over documents referenced herein.
